

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
Which skills...?

- Empathy: Understanding and responding to the feelings of others.
- Conflict Resolution: Managing and resolving disputes effectively.
- Cooperation: Working well with others to achieve a common goal.
- Adaptability: Adjusting behavior in response to different social situations.
- Understanding Cues: Interpreting body language, tone of voice, and social norms.
- Group Dynamics: Navigating and contributing to group interactions.

- Verbal exchange: Speaking clearly and effectively.
- **Listening Skills:** Actively listening and understanding others.
- Non-Verbal exchange: Using body language, facial expressions, and gestures.
- Written echange: Effectively writing messages, reports, emails, etc.
- Presentation Skills: Effectively presenting information to an audience.
- Clarity and Conciseness: Being clear and to the point in conveying one's message..

Let's look at 21st century skills in action...

- Each kid gets a role (one kid is responsible for finding the pictures, the other kid is responsible for sketching up the map on paper, the third kid will draw up the signs for buildings)

'21st century skills often integrated into our standard activities. They're easier to develop if we take a more mindful approach towards learning and teaching, i.e.:

- plan how to approach a task
 - do a demo for the students
- monitor while they're working, and do some microteaching
 - use checklists to reinforce tasks and feedback
 - get students to justify their answers
 - get students to reflect on their performance

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


Bloom's Taxonomy






Which is the odd one out? (2 approaches)




